The City Centre Zip Line

For daredevils and scenery voyeurs, ZipCity Macau offers a stunning and shocking ride straight through the centre of the city while hanging on a wire, 60 meters above ground and 388 meters of riding. Don't worry about recording the moment with your smartphone, it will be very vulnerable to the intense speed and your trembling hands. The staff will supply you with reliable GoPros, which perfectly capture every single moment. You start on the rooftop of the building, looking down 10 stories onto the ground. In the middle of the ride, you'll see the end eventually. And finally, in the end, you can decide to go down the stairs or do a rope-controlled free-fall. Customize the ridge to your risk-taking side!

The Grand Prix Museum

I loved this museum. Right when you walk in, you see a model of an F3 race car—and that starts your heart like a racecar on three, two, one, GO! And then the insides of one. There's a section for Grand Prix and Motor Sport, which are behind ropes and are untouchable

because of their incredible worth. As you walk through, you see fine simulations that imitate what it's like to be in the driver's seat. You feel the rush as the steering wheel tries to go against you. The atmosphere at the Grand Prix Museum is thrilling, modern, and quiet.

Studio City

Styled like Hollywood, another wonderful extension to Macau's labyrinth of shopping malls, Studio City features attractions unlike any you have seen before. For example, the Ferris wheel in the center of the commercial building moves in a figure eight. Alongside this, there is a huge indoor and outdoor waterpark that is perfect for any age group. After visiting the waterpark, I noticed that it has a different atmosphere and structure compared to others—the slides go outside the building, and sometimes you slide upwards! Very unexpected. In addition to the aqua fun, a surreal 4D simulation named Batman Dark Flight lets you experience Batman saving Gotham City. Also home to many luxurious shops and hotels, Studio City is a must-go in Macau.

Cuisine! Cuisine!

As stated above, you might be wondering what you might eat in Macau. Here are some must-eats in Macau: the egg tarts, a Macau specialty that combines both Chinese and Portuguese culture, served warm, the pastry combines a warm crusty texture with a creamy bite of egg. Another traditional snack is the pork chop bun, the pork patty is seasoned with vinegar, garlic, and soy sauce, enhancing the tenderness of the meat, the specially fried buttered bun also gives the sandwich another flavour.
